1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
This Act may be cited as "Jane's Law".
5 SEC. 2. SPOUSAL OBLIGATIONS.
6 (a) In General.—Chapter 11A of title 18, United

7 States Code, is amended—

1	(1) in the chapter heading by inserting "AND
2	SPOUSAL OBLIGATION" after "CHILD
3	SUPPORT"; and
4	(2) by adding at the end the following:
5	"§ 228A. Failure to pay legal spousal court-ordered

7	"(a) Offense.—Whoever knowingly, travels in inter-
8	state or foreign commerce, with the intent to evade compli-
9	ance with a court ordered property distribution shall be
10	imprisoned for not more than two years, fined under this
11	title, or both.
12	"(b) Mandatory Restitution.—Upon a conviction
13	under this section, the court shall order restitution under
14	section 3663A in an amount equal to the total unpaid
15	amount under the court ordered property distribution.
16	"(c) Definition.—The term 'court ordered property
17	distribution' means an amount of more than $$5,000$ deter-
18	mined under a court order pursuant to the law of a State
19	or of an Indian tribe to be due to a spouse or former
20	spouse as an equitable or other distribution of assets in
21	connection with a separation or divorce.".
